

## Frequency Management Agreement

It is agreed by the Thousand Oaks Soaring Society (TOSS) and by the Conejo Quiet Flyers(CQF), both of which are Chartered Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) clubs that approved FCC frequencies for the operation of Radio Controlled Aircraft shall be shared as follows:

### On 72 Mhz;

TOSS shall only use the following channels:

11,13,15,16,18,19,20,22,23,24,25,26,29,30,31,33,34,35,36,37,38,39,42,44,45,46,48,50,52,54,55,56,57,58,59,60

CQF shall only use the following channels:

12,14,16,17,21,27,28,32,40,41,46,47,49,51,53

### On the Amateur Radio frequencies;

TOSS shall only use the following channels: 02,05,08,09,53.4,53.5



CQF shall only use the following frequencies: 00,01

Neither club shall be restrict for transmitters that operate on any frequency that uses spread spectrum technology because this mode of transmission does not produce interference.

If either club holds a special event that is expected to use restricted frequencies the club holding the special event shall notify an officer of the other club and reach agreement on the date and time. Should the parties agree that it is necessary for the club not holding the event to cease operation on their approved use frequencies, then the club holding the event shall provide a sign to be posted one week in advance of the special event to be posted on the field(s) of the club not holding the event. Both clubs agree that they will not unreasonably withhold approval.

The undersigned members further agree that this agreement can only be revoked by mutual agreement, is not transferable, and that every effort shall be made in the future to cooperate on amendments to this agreement as the methods of transmission may change in the future.
