


The New Meeting Place


Hi Martin,


12-volt winches with retrievers, approximately 500 feet to turn around. Grass landing area (may be moved or not). Port-a-potty on site.

Valid AMA membership card required. Landings must be below berm and within the fence line on the East, South and the West for flight points. All SC² and AMA rules apply.


