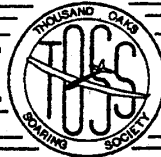

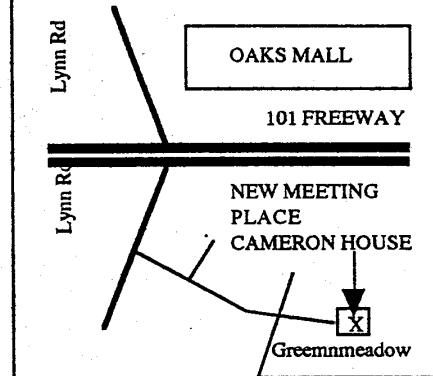
So folks, here's another sign up sheet in here some where. Put your name on it with all the other info, and send a check just to see if it's going to be as good this year as it was last year.....

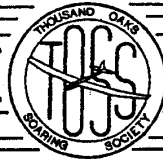

Now, a short drum roll RRRRRRRRRR. That was almost two long - RRR - better !

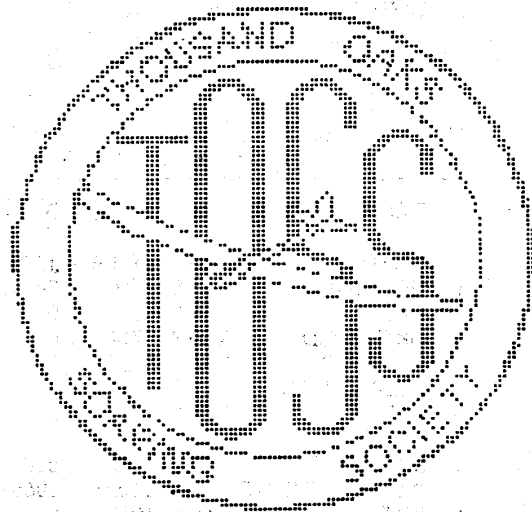
Bob Goldsmith has taken Two Meter first place. Ta Da!

**8TH ANNUAL R/C
HAND LAUNCHED
GLIDER CONTEST**

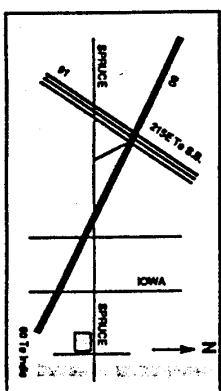
The Inland Soaring Society's 8th Annual R/C Hand Launched glider contest is coming up this June 2. There will be a raffle, and some major prizes. (glue, hand launch plans, kits, even radios), SO DON'T MISS IT!

The rules and task will be very simple. Any glider with a projected wing span of sixty inches or less, no matter how many functions will qualify. Anyone may throw your glider for you. Three rounds will be flown. Round One will be a ten minute slot in which each pilot may launch as many times as possible with only your three longest flights counting. The pilot with the highest total time will receive 1000 points and all other scoring will be Man-On-Man. Round Two will be a ten minute slot with unlimited launches to attempt a five minute precision/duration flight. If no one makes five minutes, the pilot with the longest flight will receive 1000 points and all other scoring will be Man-On-Man. Round Three will be a ten minute slot with six launches, best five count with two minute maximum. The pilot with the highest total time will receive 1000 points and all other scoring will be Man-On-Man. In all rounds, flights must end before the slot is over to count, any flight that ends after the slot will be scored a zero.

Entry fee is \$6.00. Registration starts at 8:00 AM, with the pilot's meeting at 9:00 AM sharp. Mark your calendar for June 2, 1991 and make your way to Riverside, California for fun, excitement, and big prizes! For more information - call Ian Douglas (714) 621-2522 after 6:00 PM

4. If called flight order is used it must be posted. All blumes must be posted by round and the unofficial final standings of all contestants must be posted.
5. The pilot is responsible for time on the watch. No reflight due to timer not starting or resetting the watch. The watch used must show total time to be allowed.
6. A jury of any three (SC)² Board of Directors shall be selected at all (SC)² contests to aid in any dispute that may arise. The President or his representative will select the jury.
7. All (SC)² contests must be A.M.A. sanctioned. (444-OPEN)
8. Trophies or plaques will be presented to the overall top 5 flyers and to the next 3 in the "SPORTSMAN" class. A flyer may receive only one trophy. That means if a "SPORTSMAN" places in the top 5 overall then his SPORTSMAN class trophy will be given to the next highest placing flyer in that class.
9. All (SC)² contests will be "UNLIMITED-OPEN CLASS" only for all models. No 2-meter or SCALE classes.
10. All (SC)² contests will have a cut off time for sign-up no earlier than 9:00 A.M.
11. In an (SC)² contest in order to be awarded landing points, there must be no lost parts (exception of rubber bands or bolt heads) and landing skid) during the landing, no inverted position of the model, and the model must be flyable by the next round. If a contestant loses parts from his model during launch or in flight, he may continue the flight.
12. The entry fee will be \$6.00; \$1.00 of this will go to (SC)²; \$5.00 will remain with the host club (this fee includes line retrievals).
13. The scorecards from an (SC)² contest must be given by the C.D. to the (SC)² President at the end of the contest. He will calculate and normalize scores, year-end and date standings, print results and distribute copies to the representatives of each club. If a contestant wishes, a copy will be sent to his residence. A self-addressed, stamped envelope must be provided to the (SC)² President for this purpose.
14. Each club may have a team. It will be selected from the top 4 finishers from each club for each contest. Each person must declare which club they are flying for at the time of registration.
15. There will be 3 rounds flown at all (SC)² contests. All rounds must be of equal value (1000 points each) exception is 3 flights for "x" minutes with three 100 point measured landings. A club may offer different tasks within a round only if they are of equal value. The landing value for any task may be no more than 300 points.
16. In "MAN-ON-MAN" events only the flight points will be normalized. Precision and landing points will remain unchanged during scoring. In a "MAN-ON-MAN" flight group the time between the first pilot in

17. Each club must be aware of the problems and obstacles that exist at their field and use good judgement when setting up qualifying areas for landing.
18. Winch lines must be 600 feet or longer unless field conditions require shorter length lines.
19. There will be 10 (SC)² contests in 1990. (SC)² will throw out a flyer three lowest contest scores, keeping 7. Year-end team places will be determined by the scores from each team for all 10 contests. For the purpose of year-end results normalized scores will be used for both individual and team results.
20. When setting up the contest schedule for the upcoming year the first place team from the previous year gets first pick; second place gets second pick -- and so on.
21. NO METAL landing aids forward of the tow hook will be allowed.
22. Past (SC)² Presidents will remain voting members of the (SC)² organization. They will have a vote equal to that of a club; however one person may have only one vote.
23. The term for (SC)² President is 1 year. There is no limit to the number of terms a person may serve.
24. Admittance of a club in the (SC)² organization must be approved by a majority vote.
25. A "SPORTSMAN CLASS" has been created. During registration at the first contest a person enters he will state which class he will complete in. (It is hoped that if you are an "EXPERT" flyer you will be honest and place yourself in that class). A flyer may move up to "EXPERT" at any contest. If you are a "SPORTSMAN" and you place twice in any (SC)² contests then you will be moved up automatically at the next (SC)² contest.
26. A "SPORTSMAN" flyer will be allowed one "pop-off" per contest. In the event of a pop-off he has the option of a relaunch or to continue with the flight. If he chooses a re-flight he (or his timer) must immediately declare that a relaunch will be done. The flyer must then land as soon as possible to avoid interference with other models in the air. He will be given the next available winch for the re-flight, or at the option of the C.D. placed in a later flight group.

CHANGES TO 1991 RULES

1. REVISED #2 SECRETARY WAS PRESIDENT
2. CHANGED #3 B. TO CLAIRIFY THE RELAUNCH and added #3 D. timer may count during last 10 sec.
3. added to #5 WATCH must show total time.
4. added to #11 lost parts -- bolt head
5. SFVSE ADDED as a TEAM CLUB.

NOTE: TPG & DUST MAY EXCHANGE DATES FOR THEIR CONTESTS.

RULES - revised, JANUARY 1991

1. Safety is paramount in all (SC)² contests. It is the responsibility of the Contest Director and the host club to take any and all steps necessary to insure the safety of participants, spectators, and property at an (SC)² contest. This includes equipment used. Each contestant must have his A.M.A. number on the model he is flying or he will receive "0" for the round. Transmitters must be identified.
2. All clubs hosting an (SC)² contest must prepare a contest notice at least 60 days in advance of their contest. The notice must contain the following information:
 - A. Contest Director's name and phone number and the name and phone number of the club's president.
 - B. Host Club
 - C. Location (including a map)
 - D. Events--Thermal duration and precision tasks only.
 - E. Date
 - F. Scoring
 - G. Type of winches
 - H. Length of winch lines
 - I. Landing surface
 - J. Special Rules -- i.e. any freq. not usable

Send the contest notice to the (SC)² Secretary.

If the contest notice is not received by the (SC)² Secretary at least 60 days prior to the contest, the following "STANDARD" contest must be run:

- Rounds 1,2, and 3 -- contestant flies his choice of at
3 min., 700 flight points & 300 landing points or
5 min., 800 flight points & 200 landing points or
7 min., 900 flight points & 100 landing points.

Flight score will be a straight line with 0 points at 0 sec.





3. The following A.M.A. Competition Regulations will be waived:

- A. Pg. 90 number 9d - two contestants may fly the same model.
- B. Pg. 90 number 7.2a - replace with --





If a contestant's model collides in flight with another model they are to continue the flight with no relaunch. If the model collides with another model during the landing approach, then either contestant may receive a relaunch to earn his landing points. The flight time will be changed based upon the time under or over for a two minute precision flight added to error of time from flight with collision.

- C. Pg. 90 number 7.2c - add - If a relaunch is granted due to launching system malfunction the contestant has 10 seconds to accept the relaunch or continue the flight.
- D. Pg. 91 number 10.2.2e - delete -- timer may count during last 10 seconds of a flight.
